My Vision: It was at the end of a recent prayer meeting that I heard and saw the effects of a gale force wind as it entered the church building at the western front then in a nano second rushed out through the rear wall. We will experience demonstrations of God's mighty power, but nothing will be able to stand before it except the pure in heart kept "In the cleft of the rock" as the wind passes by them.

The apostle John appeals to the church: "He that has this hope purifies himself, even as he is pure." The warning to us is that failure to purify ourselves will expose us to God's wind of purification; the judgement seat of Christ talks of our lives not only producing gold, silver and precious stones but also wood, hay and stubble. God's wind is to purge the church now so that we will not be blown away with that "Mighty rushing wind."
